


Local Foundation

About Us

The Wet Mountain Valley Rotary Club is dedicated to helping the people of Custer County and the surrounding area. Rotary has been active in Custer County since 1968, providing scholarships for our high school seniors, providing computers to our elementary classrooms, helping those in need with remodeling or relocation, bringing Santa to elementary students, and visiting shut-ins at Christmas by bringing toiletries and goodies.

Fundraisers for the scholarships include the annual Rotary Pancake Breakfast in July and the annual Rotary Scholarship Golf Tournament.

Programs

Our Rotary Van Service transports anyone, at no charge, with a variety of needs to locations within a 75 mile radius. Over 25 drivers are Rotarian and non-Rotarian volunteers.

Our Lending Medical Aids program provides

crutches, walkers, hospital beds, canes, and scooters. It is self-sustaining through donations from both clients and local residents.

Our Rotary Youth Exchange has sent students from Custer County to New Zealand, Argentina, Hungary, Austria, Finland, Germany, Denmark and Italy. We have sponsored students from Taiwan, France, Denmark, Austria, Romania, Finland and Poland.

Our distinct point of view and approach give us unique advantages, including our multi-disciplinary perspective that helps us face challenges in unique ways. Our passion and perseverance create lasting change in our community and across the globe.

How did we get here?

Making history and bringing our world closer together for over 100 years, we've taken on some of the world's toughest challenges and helped a wide range of international and service organizations – from the U.N. to Easter Seals – get started.

There are 33,000 Rotary clubs in over 200 countries in the world, working to serve humanity. Right now, Rotary clubs working together are on the verge of completely eradicating polio throughout the world.

How do we use our funds?

Responsible leadership means more than just doing good work – it means making the most out of every donation we receive. Whether we're helping to eradicate polio in Pakistan or providing clean water to schools in Mozambique, our work is funded by three sources – our members, outside donors and market investment. We use over 90 percent of our funding for service programs.

What we do with donations?

Gifts to the Rotary Foundation fund thousands of projects, such as one-million dollars spent on rapid response grants to fight polio outbreaks in the Horn of Africa/Middle-East, \$98,500 to provide clean drinking water, irrigate crops and establish fish farms in rural Kenya, \$25,550 to provide 600 indigent women in Honduras with business training and access to small loans in partnership with the micro-lender Adelante Foundation.
